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The health and safety of patients and staff is our top priority. It is our responsibility to the community and for everyone to do their part to help contain this problem. In order to keep everyone as safe as possible we have implemented the following guidelines:

We are asking our patients who feel ill and have a cough, fever, or shortness of breath to please reschedule appointments.

If you are experiencing flu-like symptoms, OR if you have traveled outside the country or to any COVID-19 "hot-spots" in the past 14 days, please notify our office at 785-537-2420 to reschedule your appointment.

When patients arrive for their scheduled appointments we are requesting the waiting room and clinic areas be kept minimally occupied. To help us achieve this please limit the number of persons accompanying you to 1.

Manhattan Eye Care practices "Universal Precautions" in our clinic areas, thereby meeting and /or exceeding all accepted standards and providing the safest environment possible for our patients and staff.

KDHE is now recommending a 14-day home quarantine for Kansans who have:

- Traveled to a state with known widespread community transmission (currently California, New York and Washington state) on or after March 15, 2020.
- Visited Eagle, Summit, Pitkin and Gunnison counties in Colorado within the past week.
- Traveled on a cruise ship on or after March 15, 2020.
- People who have previously been told by Public Health to quarantine because of their cruise ship travel should finish out their quarantine.
- People who have previously been told by Public Health to quarantine because of their international travel should finish out their quarantine.
- Traveled internationally on or after March 15, 2020.
- Received notification from public health officials (state or local) that you are a close contact of a laboratory-confirmed case of COVID-19. You should quarantine at home for 14 days since your last contact with the case. (a close contact is defined as someone who has been closer than 6 feet or more than 10 minutes while the patient is symptomatic.)
